

## Changes to ITT Mentoring from September 2024

- Mentors will follow the ITT Mentor Programme of Study. This will develop the mentor's skills and they will learn how to support their trainee throughout the training year.
- All school based mentors will complete 20 hours of training in their first year as a mentor. However, providers will be able to take into account previous training and experience and this may reduce the training requirement.
- Long-term, there will be two mentor training pathways. Mentors who have not mentored before will complete the 20 hours of training and those who have already completed the training will complete 6 hours of training.
- The 20 hours of training will be delivered throughout the academic year. Some of the training will be in person, some will take place online and some will be recorded and can be completed at a time convenient to the mentor.
- Trainees are entitled to 1.5 hours of mentor support each week. This will be made up of a meeting, a lesson observation and feedback after the observation.
- Schools will be able to claim a grant to help with the cost of teachers being away from the classroom whilst they train as mentors. More information can be found on page 15 of this document
