The aims of this free programme are to:

- Give students an insight into the world of teaching and opportunities therein
- Provide them with an overview of the general principles of teaching and learning
- Develop their confidence, communication and leadership skills by working with professionals, peers and teaching younger students
- Reflect on their own strengths and aptitudes in the field of teaching
- Share their subject knowledge and expertise with local primary schools
- Provide primary school children with a unique and memorable experience
- Inspire students to become future educators

This programme gives Year 12 students the opportunity to work together with subject specialist teachers, peers and younger students. Weekly sessions equip them with the theoretical framework to be able to observe lessons meaningfully, as well as to teach their chosen subject at KS3, KS4 and at a local primary school. Students are supervised by and work closely with a member of staff who gives them feedback and helps them reflect on their progress along the way, as well as share insights into the teaching profession. In order to show that they have successfully completed the programme students are required to complete a Learning Journal as they go through the different stages

Students receive an Alban Education Certificate of Achievement upon completing the programme.

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Pupils, and students in the sixth form, have meaningful opportunities to experience different workplaces. They also make useful connections with employers to learn about different occupations. This includes providing sixth-form students interested in careers in education opportunities to teach younger pupils alongside teaching staff."
